Auslan (Australian Sign Language) is the language of the Australian Deaf Community. It incorporates signs, fingerspelling, facial expression and body movement to create a beautiful and unique language.



Why learn AUSLAN?

- Auslan is a recognised VCE LOTE
- Auslan enhances your vocational opportunities in a number of specific areas. (*Teacher of the Deaf, Speech Therapy, Social Work, Youth Work, Interpreter*)
- Auslan will enable you a broader client base in other chosen careers, where deaf people may choose your business because you are able to communicate with them.
- Auslan facilitates communication between the deaf and hearing communities and opens your eyes to the cultural and linguistic heritage of one of Australia's unique cultural communities.
- Auslan gives you confidence and a way to enhance your personal skills by communicating in a distinctive way.
- If you are Deaf, or have family members or friends who are Deaf, Auslan is a great way to boost your VCE results!

Auslan classes are open to Year 10, 11 and 12 students from any school in Victoria. In 2018, classes for units 1 and 2 will run on Monday afternoons from 2:00 pm to 5:00 pm. Classes for units 3 and 4 will run on Monday afternoon from 4:30 to 7:30.

Classes cost \$500 per semester. A non-refundable deposit of \$250 is required for enrolment. Payment is required by Friday, December 1, 2017. The remaining \$250 for semester 1 is to be paid by the start of the 2018 school year. Payment details for Semester 2 will be sent to parents.
